#### What's the purpose of interviews?

- Can you do the job?
- Can you demonstrate the behaviours required of the job?
- How well will you fit with the team and the organisation?

### **Behavioural Interviewing**

- Behavioural questions
- Specific examples
- Evidence prove it!!

"Tell me about a time where...

You have dealt with a difficult customer?

When you had to deal with a conflict within your team?

You made a decision, which you knew would be unpopular with a group of people?"



### **Traditional Interview questions**

- How would you handle a customer complaint?
- What are your strengths and weaknesses?
- Why should you be the successful candidate for this position?
- If you could be any animal what would you be and why?



#### **Typical questions**

 Based on the job profiles for the roles you will be applying for - what's some of the typical questions you might get asked?

Work in pairs and come up with 3 or 4



#### Be an interview STAR!

- **S** What was the **situation**?
- T What was the task?
- A What actions did you take?
- **R** What was the overall **result**?
- R In **reflection**, what did you learn? what would you do differently next time?
- R What relationships did you build?





# Using STAR to demonstrate your skills

- Based on the job profiles for the roles you will be applying for - look at the skills and behaviours
- How might you demonstrate your suitability using STAR?
- Pick a skill or behaviour from the Job Profile, use the STAR template to work through an example to demonstrate how you have used that skill in your role.
- Share your example with a partner.



# "And do you have any questions for the panel....?

#### One final opportunity to leave an impression.

What kind of things might you ask about...?

- Team you will work with
- Direction of the service
- Development opportunities

#### Split into small groups of 3 or 4...

2 questions per candidate -

- Panel to ask 1 using the example the candidate has picked
- Panel picks one other interview question
- Candidate to ask their question to the panel
   Feedback 2 highlights and 1 improvement

#### Some Extra Tips...



#### Do

Be honest – stick to the facts

Keep to the point – ask for questions to be repeated if necessary

Know when to stop talking

Take credit – tell the panel what you did

Have good eye contact and body language

Double-check the time and place of your interview!

Turn up 10 minutes early

Dress the part

Prepare, prepare, prepare!!

#### Don't

Make it up or bluff

Fill silences

Use jargon or abbreviations

Assume they know you and your job

Be negative about past jobs or employers

Share overly personal information





#### And relax.....

- Be prepared
- Visualise success
- Breathe deeply
- Move, for example go for a walk before, pull faces (although not in interview) to alleviate tension
- Take sips of water
- Stand tall, walk tall, sit tall (gives you confidence)



### What if you aren't successful?


Don't be disheartened
